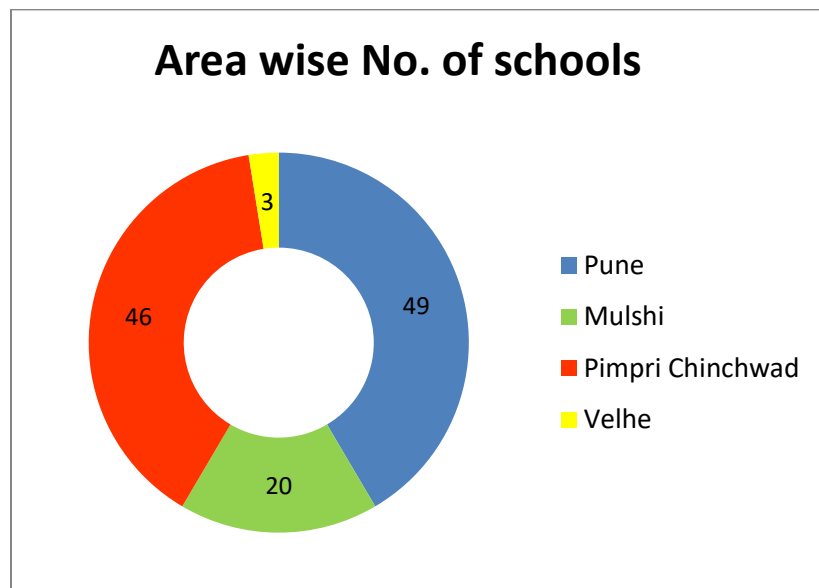




Annual Report 2017-18

The year 2017-18 was full of events and activities. This year was Step Up foundations (SUF) 7th anniversary year. In this year Step Up foundation was involved in various activities and events. The year started in April with summer camps in communities followed by Adolescent health education program in various schools started in June. This year apart from our own project in schools, we worked in collaboration with other NGO's like Samavedana, USK foundation, SOS BAL gram, Miracle foundation, Delhi etc.

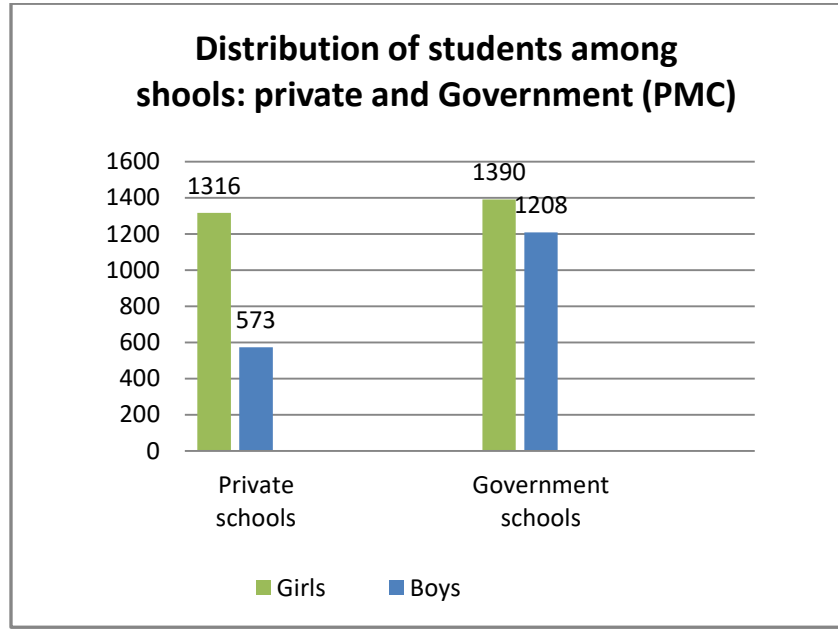
This year Adolescent health education and touch awareness project is implemented in Pune, Pimpri Chinchwad, Mulshi and Velhe tehsil area. Through this we could reach 28,828 students in total.



Adolescent health education program

The core working area of SUF is adolescent health education. SUF mainly focus on reproductive health and sexuality related awareness. Sessions are mainly conducted for 9th std students. It is a 10 days curriculum, 1hr every day, with each 9th std. Group.

For year 2017-18 under Adolescent health education program we covered total 29 schools; both private and PMC schools.



The Adolescent health education program started in June 2017.

SUF has good rapport with these schools and got good cooperation from them.

Step up foundation conducted Adolescent health education program for 20 higher secondary PMC schools and 9 private schools.

This year we tried few experiments with students. We asked them to come up with some innovative social work ideas, which they have to run in their own school, their own society etc. Total 5 schools participated in this activity. Students participated in various activities like school & classroom cleaning; they conducted awareness sessions on safe touch, de addiction, for 5th to 8th std. classes.

Step up foundation felicitated children who participated in social activities. Step up foundation arranged a felicitation program for all PMC schools. The chief guest for this program was **Mr. Vinod Tawade, Education Minister, Maharashtra.**

Networking with JJB

Since 3 years step up foundation is working for Juveniles under Juvenile Justice Board. Step up foundation conducted different activities, like individual & group counseling, art & craft activity, gardening and composting activities for Juveniles and bail out children.

We conducted the gardening activity for four months, March, April, May & June 2017. This activity planned twice a week for two hours. An average 15 boys participated in this activity

Physical and mental Health awareness sessions:-

In slums it is seen that people are unaware about importance of physical health. To aware them about good physical and mental health, we conducted physical awareness sessions on regular basis. These sessions were conducted through interaction and street plays. **This program conducted for 313 hours. 1277 women and girls are benefited.**
